Whereas, Student Senate promotes the notion that education should be accessible for all, and
Whereas, it is difficult to receive this education when costs are too high because of out of state tuition, and
Whereas, out of state tuition is applied to those who are undocumented citizens, and
Whereas, AB 95 would allow a person who is not a legal permanent resident of the US to pay resident, as opposed to non-resident, tuition if he/she has graduated from a Wisconsin high school or received a GED in Wisconsin, was continuously present in Wisconsin for at least one year following the first day of attending a Wisconsin high school, and enrolls in a UW system institution and provides the institution an affidavit that he/she has or will file an application for permanent residency with the INS as soon as he/she is eligible to; therefore,
Be it resolved, Student Association Student Senate supports this bill and consequently charges the Legislative Issues Committee to work accordingly on the legislation.

Whereas, Student Senate promotes the notion that education should be accessible for all, and
Whereas, it is understood that many times students need financial aid to achieve a college education, and
Whereas AB 342 bans those individuals convicted of possessing, with intent to manufacture, distribute, or deliver, or of manufacturing, distributing or delivering, a controlled substance or a controlled substance analog ineligible for a state grant, loan or work assistance for a period of two years after the first conviction and indefinitely after the second conviction; therefore

Be it resolved, that Student Association Student Senate opposes this piece of legislation and consequently charges the Legislative Issues Committee to work accordingly on the legislation.
