Whereas, there are barriers to physical access at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls, such as access to buildings and classrooms; and

Whereas, students, no matter their ability, have varying learning styles that require professors and academic staff to engage students in multiple ways in order for learning to occur; and

Whereas, faculty are not always provided with professional development opportunities to enhance or acquire effective teaching methods; and

Whereas, universal design provides a framework that enhances the teaching ability of faculty; and

Whereas, universal design takes a proactive approach that integrates planning and design to address everyone's physical and learning needs; and

Whereas, physical access and the ability to learn directly affect "student life, services, and interests;" therefore

Be It Resolved, that the Student Association Student Senate supports the establishment of universal design as the official policy of the University of Wisconsin-River Falls and the University of Wisconsin-System; and

Be It Further Resolved, that we request Chancellor Betz and the Board of Regents to take appropriate action to establish universal design as an official policy of UW-River Falls and the UW-System; and

Be It Finally Resolved, that this resolution be communicated to Chancellor Betz; Cora Marrett, Senior Vice President for Academic Affairs; Regent Elizabeth Burmaster; and United Council.
